Who We Are

Green Card Voices is a Minneapolis-based, nationally growing social enterprise that works to record and share first-person narratives of America's immigrants to facilitate a better understanding between immigrants and their communities.

Working through local partnerships with high schools, universities, and community organizations since 2013, Green Card Voices works to build a platform that amplifies the voices of immigrants. Their programming includes published books, traveling exhibits, and an online video library that currently features stories of over 500 immigrants and refugees coming from over 145 different countries.

What We Do

Sharing immigrant stories is the essence of Green Card Voices. While our stories are always available at our digital library at greencardvoices.org, the most effective way to engage students and the community is through our traveling exhibit, which can be used in tandem with our books and curriculum.



About the Exhibit

This exhibit was inspired by the book, *Green Card Youth Voices: Immigration Stories from Chicago High Schools*. Within this exhibit centers the voices of 20 immigrant and refugee youth from three high schools. They come from nineteen countries across five continents: Asia, Europe, Africa, North America, and South America—reflecting the strength and diversity of Chicago's vibrant communities.

About the Book


Through a trauma-informed, student-centered process, this nonfiction book offer deeply personal stories from youth who have fled war, political unrest, or displacement. Whether escaping the collapse of Venezuela, the war in Ukraine, or refugee camps in Tanzania, each student shares honest stories of survival, belonging, and hope.

The book began during a time of intense political change following the 2024 US presidential election, when new policies and rising anti-immigrant rhetoric created fears for those with temporary legal status. Despite these challenges, students bravely broke the silence around immigrant experiences.
